The London Police Service Multi-Faith Chaplaincy now consists of the following four faiths, Protestant, Roman Catholic, Jewish, and Muslim. Chief Brad Duncan welcomed the new appointees on board to join Father Jim Mockler and Reverend David Carrothers who have competently served in the Chaplaincy program which has been in existence for over twenty years. The Chaplains provide spiritual guidance and support for the men and women of the London Police Service and their families. Mike Deeb, Chair of London Police Services Board, remarked in his welcome to the two new members that "people need to see themselves represented and it makes communities healthier." Joe Fontana, Mayor of the city of London, expressed, "We are stronger in our diversity progressive by our diversity and the fact that we have embraced the multi-faith truly reflects the nature and spirit of our city."
