



Why CIIC

Heritage, art and culture play an increasingly vital role in fostering dialogue and cohesion among different communities and nations. Canada is a recognized global leader in promoting respect, tolerance and multi-culturalism.

Muslims represent a growing segment of Canadian society and are increasingly contributing to the fabrication of Canadian culture and values.

Most existing Canadian Islamic institutions fulfill an important role in preserving the Muslim identity and culture. However, there is a significant lack of efforts to promote and integrate Islamic heritage and culture in the wider Canadian context. The CIIC is open to all communities and individuals and will offer services ranging from social, spiritual and educational programs to entertainment, leisure and youth initiatives. The CIIC hopes to inspire all communities to embrace diversity and be instrumental in shaping a cohesive society.

Approach



"In doing so, the CIIC aims to create a unique atmosphere, bringing people together, not just at academic, professional and intellectual levels, but more crucially to the layperson living in a neighborhood where harmony and cohesion need to be promoted".

MAC also aims to offer vital cultural, social, intellectual and religious services to the Muslim Community in Montreal and Canada, in the spirit of diversity, respect and inclusiveness, and promote social journeys, physical wellness and connection to Islamic values.


3. Working in partnership

The CIIC will act as a focal point and meeting place for scholars, intellectuals, artists, institutions, and other parties which deal with studies and research on various aspects of Islamic civilization and issues pertaining to Islam, and Muslims, in the Canadian context.

The CIIC will offer health advice clinics and seminars for youth, adults and seniors. Ladies-only health classes.

Fitness club, sports activities, recreational activities and competition-based activities for people of all ages.



EDUCATION



The institute will participate in the organization of graduate studies, in cooperation with universities and other institutions of higher learning.



HERITAGE & ARTS

The CIIC will house a museum of Islamic culture and civilization and a gallery of Islamic art. In addition, the CIIC library will provide access to books, catalogues, albums, bibliographies and other reference works related to the history of Muslim nations, art, science and culture. The CIIC will also house a media centre with a

recording studio and radio station.



The Building

The CIIC enjoys a strategic location in the heart of downtown Montreal, the second largest, and most important economic and cultural city in Canada.

A concrete, 6 story building, erected in 1958, Originally the Head Office of CNC LAVALIN INC, and Located in the core of the financial and administrative district, one block south of Rene Levesque Avenue and the Golden Square.

The building is close to major Montreal art museums, communication giants, universities, colleges and hospitals.


